## **Problem 2: Relational Database and Schema**

Refer Table 2. The Product table (or relation) stores the manufacturer and model number (primary key). The PC table contains a subset of the model numbers provided in the Product table. For each model number, the speed (of the processor, in megahertz), the amount of RAM (in megabytes), the speed and type of the removable disk (CD or DVD), and the price is provided. The Printer relation records another set of models, and stores whether the printer produces color output (true/false)), the process type (laser, ink-jet, or bubble), and the price.

Write down the schema for these three relations.

- 8. Find all the distinct manufacturers that produces both, computers worth less than \$1000 and More than \$2000
- 9. Update the price of all PC by \$100
- 10. Delete all black & white printers
