1 Introduction

This document describes the Monroe Plan Corpus, a collection of plan sessions generated automatically using an AI Planner. We have used this corpus in training and evaluating our goal recognition algorithms [BA06b, BA06a].

2 Files in the Distribution

The distribution contains two files:

- monroePlanCorpus.pdf: this document
- monroe5000.txt: a file containing the 5000 plans. These are represented in s-expressions in the SHOP2 format.

The modified SHOP2 planner as well as the code used to generate this corpus are also available online.

The methodology for creating this corpus is detailed in [Bla05, BA05].
