#### 4. (5 points)

What relation is obtained by selecting from the T-V-N-S relation using the condition "Variety = black OR Variety = white"?

# 5. (5 points)

Provide an expression (or an explicit sequence of operations) using selection, projection, and join that provides a (minimal) answer to the question "what is the common name (type and variety) of the tree whose scientific name (genus and species) is Picea pungens?" (The answer is Blue Spruce. I'm not interested in the answer, but in the relational operations used to obtain it.)

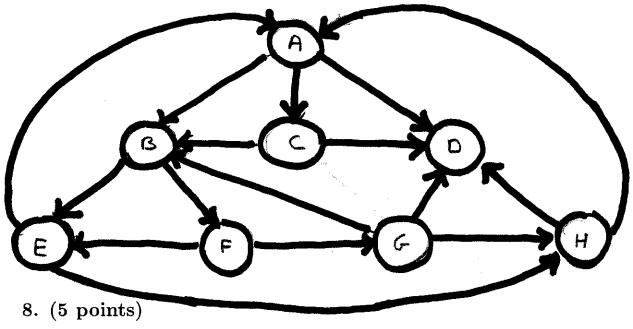

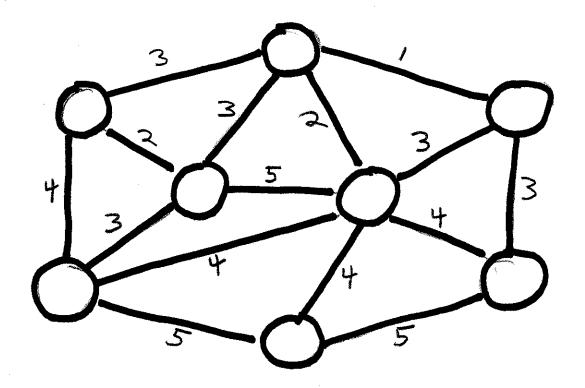

Provide a depth-first and a breadth-first traversal order for the following graph starting at the node marked A. Visit links counterclockwise from the top.

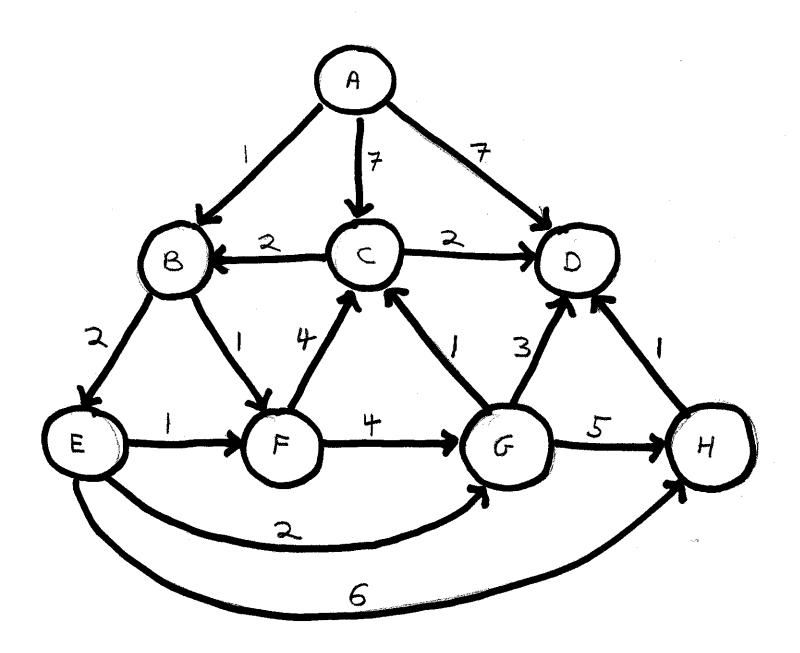


Provide a minimum spanning tree for the following graph.

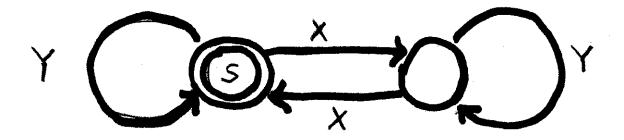
