One of our general models of computation

- Regular expressions
- Grammars context-free and otherwise
- Automata "machines"

Help answer the question: What is computation?

- Computing a function relating input and output
- Generating or enumerating a language
- Accepting or recognizing an input

Types of Automata

- Finite automata regular languages
- Push-down automata context-free languages
- Linear-bounded automata context-sensitive languages
- Turing machines recursively enumerable languages
- There are others: random access machines, parallel random access machines, arrays of automata

Characteristics of Automata

- State
- Input and/or output
- Transitions
- Computation as a sequence of steps
- Configuration: everything the machine needs to continue the computation
- Computing a function or accepting a language

How Types of Automata Differ

- In the particular details of the model
- In complexity (or simplicity)
- In power
- In the functions that can be computed
- In the languages that can be accepted
