Definition 0.1 Let G = (V, E) be a directed graph. Let $s, t \in V$ be two distinct vertices. An *s*-*t* cut is a pair of disjoint sets A, B such that $s \in A, t \in B$, and $A \cup B = V$.

We will prove

Theorem 0.2 Let G = (V, E) be a directed graph with edge capacities $c : E \to \mathbb{R}_{\geq 0}$. Let $s, t \in V$ be two distinct vertices. We have

$$\max_{s-t \text{ flows } f} |f| = \min_{s-t \text{ cuts } A, B} \operatorname{capacity}(A, B).$$

Definition 0.3 Let G = (V, E) be a directed graph. Let $s, t \in V$ be two distinct vertices. An *s*-*t* alternative-cut is a pair of disjoint sets A, B such that $s \in A, t \in B, A \cup B = V$, every vertex in A is reachable from s using paths contained in A, and every vertex in B can reach t using paths contained in B.

Prove or disprove

Conjecture 1 Let G = (V, E) be a directed graph with edge capacities $c : E \to \mathbb{R}_{\geq 0}$. Let $s, t \in V$ be two distinct vertices. Assume that every $v \in V$ is reachable from s. Assume that t can be reached from every $v \in V$. We have

 $\max_{s\text{-}t \ flows \ f} |f| = \min_{s\text{-}t \ alternative\text{-}cuts \ A, \ B} \operatorname{capacity}(A, B).$
